General Guidelines

All rings will start at 08:00am – entry to show field will be from 06:30am

Vaccinations –All animals must have up to date vaccinations (*within 12 months to date of show*)

Competitor numbers – Numbers will be provided on the day. Your number can be collected from the Secretaries tent from 7am. Please bring your Passport when collecting your number. Random passport checks will take place. Pre-entry numbers will be published on our Facebook page prior to the show.

Parking – All light horses & working hunter competitors **MUST** park as directed by official attendants. To gain access to the show rings all competitors must use the horse walks where provided. Spectators must park in the area specified as directed.

Under no circumstances should horses/ponies be left tied unattended outside their trailers/lorries

Catering will be available on the show field.

Insufficient Entries – The committee reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes if necessary.

Supreme Championship – to be judged once all classes are finished. The Champion from each section shall go forward to the designated ring. Exhibitors will be advised on the day where to gather & stewards will be available to direct them.

All exhibitors please note; Classes will NOT be held up for you if your previous class hasn't finished. The judge's decision is final. Please adhere to the requests of the committee, stewards & volunteers at all times. The Committee (or anyone acting under their instruction) will, on no account, be held responsible or liable for any loss, damage or injury to any exhibitor, spectator, or their property.

N.P.S. M&M WORKING HUNTER PONY SECTION

Judges: Deborah Chadwick, Lancs and Diane Hadwen, West Yorkshire

No rider may ride more than one pony in a class except that riders in all WHP and Arena Eventing classes (excluding training stakes) that are not qualifiers for HOYS or RIHS may ride up to two ponies of the same height in a class, and both ponies can go forward for show and conformation judging. There must be no change of rider between the phases

THE NPS/STEVENSON BROTHERS ROCKING HORSES M&M FIRST RIDDEN WORKING HUNTER PONY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (MM-FRWHP)

Class 1 Open to registered M&M mares or geldings four years old or over not exceeding 128 cm. Riders must have attained their 5th birthday but must not have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

Riders who have qualified for the (Horse of the Year Show/RIHS) M&M Working Hunter Pony Championship before the 1st January in the current year are not eligible. Ponies must not be asked to gallop. The three highest placed ponies, owned by an NPS member, in each class go forward to the final. Where these ponies have already qualified the pony standing next in line, which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than fifth place

FENCE: Height: Min – 47cms (1'6") Max – 53 cms (1'9") Spread Max – 47cms (1'6")

THE NPS/THE NICHOLLS FAMILY M&M JUNIOR WORKING HUNTER PONY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (MM-JWHP)

Class 2 Ponies not exceeding 128cm. Riders must not have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

Class 3 Ponies exceeding 128 cm but not exceeding 138cm. Riders must not have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

Class 4 Ponies exceeding 138cm but not exceeding 148cm (except for Dales and Welsh Section D for which there is no height restriction).

Riders must not have attained their 18th birthday by the 1st January in the current year.

Open to registered pure bred M&M stallions, mares and geldings, four years old or over. The three highest placed ponies, owned by an NPS member, in each class go forward to the final. Where these ponies have already qualified the pony standing next in line, which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than fifth place.

THE NPS M&M NOVICE WORKING HUNTER PONY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (MM-NWHP)

Class 5 Ponies not exceeding 122cms

Class 6: Ponies exceeding 122cms but not exceeding 133cms

Class 7: Ponies exceeding 133cms but not exceeding 143cms

Class 8: Ponies exceeding 143cms but not exceeding 148cms (with the exception of Welsh Section D and Dales for which there is no height restriction)

Open to pure bred M&M stallions, mare and geldings, four years old or over. Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following;

- i) Won an open affiliated WHP class
- ii) Qualified for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS Open WHP classes
- iii) Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate WHP final at the NPS Summer Championship show (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit entry to the final in the first year)
- iv) If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS in its second year, it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Novice WHP Final.

THE NPS/SIMONS FAMILY & MARBETH STUD WORKING HUNTER PONY TRAINING STAKES SUMMER NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (OPEN TO M&M AND PLAITED PONIES) (O- TSWHP)

Open to mares, geldings and stallions four years old and over, in possession of an equine passport but no registration or breed society criteria. Plaited ponies to a maximum of 158cms. Riders may only ride one pony in each class.

Class 13 – Height of fences 45cms to 55 cms

Class 14 – Height of fences 55cms to 70cms

Class 15– Height of fences 70cms to 85cms

Class 16 – Height of fences 85cms to 100cms

Class 17: RIHS & SEIB OPEN WORKING SHOW HORSE QUALIFYING CLASS

Qualifier for the Open Working Show Horse Championship at The Royal International Horse Show.

All affiliated BSHA Open Working Show Horse classes are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show final and the SEIB Working Show Horse Final.

For the RIHS qualification, the winner, if not already qualified in the Working Show Horse class will qualify.

If the first has already qualified, the qualification may pass down to no lower than fifth place. For the SEIB Working Show Horse qualification, the two highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify.

Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms.

This class is NOT open to Hunters, i.e. those horses registered and competing as a hunter or working hunter with BSHA, Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain or The Showing Register for the current season.

Please refer to rule 2(iv) in the 2024 BSHA Rulebook. **The Working Show Horse qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier in order to confirm qualification.**

Any Horse which is a Grade B Showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above, as at the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible to compete in any Working Show Horse class.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase but must then select one Horse to take through to the Ride and Conformation phases (if required). No change of Rider is allowed.

Working Show Horse Height of Fences Jumps:
Open: 2'9 maximum 3'0, maximum spread 3'08

Working Show Horse courses are not to be walked by the Competitors until the Judge/s have given permission.

In the event of a tie in marks, the Conformation mark will take precedence, followed by the Ride mark, followed by the Style mark.

PERTH EQUINE VETS/BHS SCOTLAND WORKING HUNTER SERIES 2024

Judges: Sarah Ramsden and Lesley Whitehall

CLASS 18: PERTH EQUINE VETS / BHS SCOTLAND WORKING HUNTER : The horse must be four years old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx). **The rider must be a member of the British Horse Society by the time of the championships.** Riders must be **eighteen** years or over on the day of the championships.

Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water.

Qualification: The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualification can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part-breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS **Qualifying or Life** members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at, Malvern on 6 th – 8 th August 2024

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

Qualification cards for the NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Finals have been amalgamated into a single card that riders will now carry in their pockets and ask the judge to sign as appropriate. Therefore no qualification cards for these finals will be sent in your show pack. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS SCOTLAND BLAIR QUALIFIERS – RULES 2024

TO BE RUN UNDER NPS SCOTLAND FINALS (BLAIR CASTLE) RULES 2024 which are on the NPS Scotland website www.npsscotland.co.uk These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the NPS and again these can be found on our website. These are new rules this year so please be vigilant and read them. Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

M&M IN HAND CLASSES

Judge: Nicola Shuttleworth, Yorks

THE NPS/ABSORBINE M&M IN HAND SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIP (MM-IH)

These classes are open to pure bred registered M & M ponies in the main body of the studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

- a) Youngstock, stallions, mares & geldings registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society Stud Book.
- b) Handler any age, except stallions (see rules A3.2 & A2.8). Foals are not eligible.
- c) The owner does not have to be an NPS member for the pony to enter this competition but Only ponies owned by NPS Qualifying or Life members can qualify for the final.
- d) The highest placed pony, owned by an NPS member, in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line, which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place Also a qualifier for the NPS/ Mole Valley M&M Home Produced In Hand National Championship. Those eligible should wear a white armband.

NPS SCOTLAND/TOWNHEAD PET N PONY IN HAND MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND CHAMPIONSHIP.

Champion & Res. Champion in all Mixed pure-bred M & M or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2024. Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (i.e. 1st Reserve Champion).

- a) Youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.
- b) Handler any age, except stallions (see rules). Foals are not eligible.
- c) The owner of the pony does not have to be an NPS Scotland member to enter this competition, but the owner of the pony must become a member of NPS Scotland to enter the Blair final

Class 19: Small Breeds - yearlings, 2 and 3 years (Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetlands)

Class 20: Small Breeds – yearlings, 2 and 3 years (Welsh A, Welsh B)

Class 21: Small Breeds- 4 years and over (Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetlands)
